White Pine: Pinusstrobus: Our State Tree! Moderate to fast growing treereaching 80-100 feet tall. It prefers rich, moist to well-drained soils and is shade tolerant. Its soft needles grow in bundles of 5. Used for timber, wildlife, cover and windbreaks (qty 25) Blue flag with pink streamer, or plain blue

Black Walnut: Juglansnigra: Reaches 60-80 feet in height and a trunk diameter of 2-3 feet. This hardwood is shade tolerant. It grows best on moist sandy loams. The nuts produced are a good food source for wildlife. The timber is valued for furniture, veneer and gun stocks. This tree does put allelopathic chemicals into the soil which may prohibit some plants from growing (qty 25) Yellow flag with pinkstreamer, or plain Yellow flag

White Oak: Quercusalba: Slow growing tree that reaches 45-80 feet tall. Prefers full sun and well drained sandy loam to clay loam soils. Great ornamental or forest tree that is valued for timber and wildlife. (qty 25) Blue flag with green streamer

Highbush Cranberry: Viburnum trilobum: Grows 4-10 feet tall, prefers moist sites. Flowering shrub that produces small white clusters of flowers followed by red fruit. Excellent wildlife plant, fruit provides great winter food source for birds. Can tolerate some shade. (qty 25) Yellow flag with green streamer

Red Osier Dogwood: Cornusstolonifera: Grows 3-9 feet tall. Older twigs have a red or purplish red color that lasts all year creating an attractive winter focal point. This is a great plant for stream bank restoration and landscaping (qty 25).

Ninebark: Physocarpusopulifolius: Grows to 20 feet, prefers wet sites, but will grow on drier sites. Fast growing plant is shade tolerant. Has white flowers in May-June followed by blue fruit inSeptember. (qty 25) Blue flag with pinkstreamer

Serviceberry: Amelanchierarborea: Shrub or small tree up to 40 feet with a narrow crown 4-12" in diameter. Showy white flowersApril-May,with red to purple round berriesJune-August. Shade tolerant, slow growing and intolerant of moist soils. (qty 10) Yellow flag withwhite streamer

Fragrant Sumac:Rhus aromatic:This bush reaches8-18 feet in height and has a medium growth rate. The red fruit are good wildlife food and makes a good tea. It prefers dry soils and full sun to partial shade. It will make a good border planting (qty 25) Yellow flag with orange streamer

White Swamp Oak: Height 50-60', Foliage Dark Green with felty white beneath, Fall Foliage Yellow-brown to red, Exposure Full Sun(qty 13: 4 ft. saplings) Blue flag with white streamer
